

Introduction


Thousands of Hmong have learned to read from the simple Hmong primer developed by Yves Bertrais in the 1960s and copied over and over again. With the generous support of the Central Valley Foundation, a nonprofit organization that promotes issues of free speech and immigrant access to the American dream, we have developed this new primer. It is similar to the original in many ways and is also based on the White Hmong dialect. However, it is organized to reveal the regular patterns of the Hmong orthography, to promote the formation of linguistic generalizations.


This primer is for older children, teens, and adults who have learned to read English or another roman-based alphabetic language. It can also be used by non-native Hmong, as long as the instructor is a native speaker. It is based on the most frequently used 425 Hmong words.

This primer provides the raw materials for learning to decode Hmong and for developing vocabulary in Hmong. There are 25 practice readers that accompany this primer. The stories are based on Aesop's fables or authentic Hmong stories and each one uses only the phonemes learned up to that point in the primer. In the primer, the actual words are black, and the high frequency words are red; nonsense words are grey.

The power of the primer and the practice readers is in the ability of the instructor to engage the learners in the adventure of learning Hmong. Although the development of comprehensive teaching guides was not part of this project, there is a teacher's kit. The kit contains teaching suggestions, blending cards, and high frequency word cards that can be used on an overhead, in games, or in a pocket chart. The Summer Institute of Linguistics (www.sil.org) has resources for organizing literacy development programs. The instructor's guide contains accounts of SIL literacy programs in Africa and Latin America.

All materials are free, via the internet, or at cost, from our center. 

Using the materials: level 2, "t" (page 11)

Background: Use 'o' as a neutral vowel for pronouncing the initial consonant ('o'-'to'-'tov'). Students who do not pronounce phonemes or tones correctly have not had enough auditory practice. Use the command "point to" or "circle" as much as you use "say" or "read." Use writing as a way for students to learn and perform; analyze mistakes to monitor which students are experiencing trouble with which phonemes – and use that information to plan the next lesson.


Warm up (5-10 minutes): "Follow along while I read these words: tab, taj, tav, ta, tas, tam, tad, tag... (keep going to the end). Okay, now point to 'tas.' Point to 'te.' Now 'tes.' Point to the word that means 'answer'." (Continue, watch to see if students are able to recognize the word you read. If not, read words that are next to each other until students can tell which one you are pronouncing.) "Okay, now read the words aloud." (Ask students to read a line all together, then one at a time. Go across; go down). Point to words: "Read this."

Vocabulary (15 minutes): "All these could be words but they're not. The lightest ones are not real words. The dark ones are real words. Let's see if you know what they mean." (Talk about the meanings; use Heimbach's dictionary; emphasize high frequency words—in red, if you have color.) Dictate real words. Practice quick recognition with flash cards. Use word cards to build multipart words, phrases, or sentences. Have students copy these to study for the next day's dictation.

Reader (20 minutes): Go to the reader after all the primer pages for that level have been done. Ask students to read together; ask students to read a line or a page; ask students to predict what happens on the next page; read and re-read until students can recognize chunks of text. Spend time discussing what the text means. Use the questions to encourage students to understand and extend the story and its lesson (assign each student one of the questions before the story begins.)




